
The Redevelopment of AIIMS Western Campus would lead to construction of 3900 quarters for AIIMS faculty and staff and address the acute scarcity of housing for AIIMS Faculty. The proposal has been formulated by AIIMS in consultation with MOHFW and Ministry of Urban Development & Housing with NBCC as Project Management Consultant. The EFC note for the redevelopment of AIIMS campus with zero cost to Government plan resources based on monetization of 10 percent built up space of western campus and Ayurvigyan Nagar has been circulated for consideration of concerned Ministries. The Finance Secretary has been requested to convene the meeting of the EFC for early appraisal of the project. Director, AIIMS brought up the issue of allotment of residential accommodation to AIIMS, at East Kidwai Nagar for which Hon'ble Health Minister had written to the Union Finance and Urban Development Minister. Hon'ble President, AIIMS accepted the request to take the matter up with Union Urban Development Minister.

The expansion of Trauma Centre would be taken up on the 14.95 acres of land allotted by Delhi Development Authority in June 2015. The expansion project would add nearly 2000 beds to the Institute's existing strength and house the new centers for Digestive Diseases, ENT and Diabetology in addition to Spine and Transplant Center and a Expansion of Trauma Center, Research block and Residential Hostel for Residents and Nurses. TO CONSIDER THE AMENDMENT IN THE RECRUITMENT RULES FOR THE POST OF DIRECTOR, ALL INDIA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES FOR PERMITTING DIRECTOR TO REVERT BACK TO THE POST OF PROFESSOR ON COMPLETION OF HIS TENURE

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. The Governing Body & Institute Body of the PGIMER, Chandigarh have brought an amendment in the Recruitment Rules for the post of Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh vide Agenda Item No. 28 and 15 of the meeting of the Governing Body and Institute Body respectively held on 06.08.2016 thereby allowing ~~Ex-Director~~ Director to revert to the post of Professor on completion of his tenure as Director as he did not attain the age of retirement on superannuation. A copy of amended RR for the post of Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh is placed at Annexure-I.
- 1.2. The AIIMS, New Delhi has placed an agenda item before the Governing Body (Item No. GB - 154/6) and Institute Body (Item No. IB - 150/4) for consideration of enhancement of the retirement age of faculty members of the Institute from the existing 65 years to 67 years.
- 1.3. Directors of AIIMS, New Delhi would not be able to avail the benefit of this increase on retirement age since they can function as Director only upto the age of 65 years as per the provisions of the AIIMS Act. There is no reason why incumbent Directors of AIIMS should not be given the opportunity to serve on the faculty of AIIMS after demitting the office of Director, until the age of superannuation as fixed for faculty members from time to time. Such a provision would be in line with the provision made for PGIMER, Chandigarh, which is also governed by the same Act of Parliament as AIIMS.
- 1.4. Accordingly it has been felt to bring a similar amendment in the Recruitment Rules for the post of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi to allow Director, AIIMS, New Delhi, to revert to the post of Professor after completing his tenure as Director until the age of superannuation.

2. ADMINISTRATIVE COMMENTS

2.1 The existing Recruitment Rules for the post of Director, AIMS, New Delhi does not contain a provision similar to the amended Recruitment Rules for the post of Director, PGIMER, Chandigarh as referred above. A copy of the existing RR for the post of Director, AIMS, New Delhi is enclosed at Annexure II.
