

1. INTRODUCTION

Dr. Randeep Guleria, Professor & Head, Department of Pulmonary Medicine & Sleep was appointed to the post of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi for a period of five years from the date of assumption of charge of post or till attaining the age of 65 years or until further orders, whichever is earlier. Dr. Randeep Guleria assumed the charge of the post of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi on 24.03.2017 (AN). Dr. Randeep Guleria is completing his tenure as Director, AIIMS, New Delhi on 24.03.2022 (AN). It was decided to initiate the process for selection of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi so that the approval of Appointments Committee of Cabinet (ACC) may be obtained as per the stipulated time frame.

Accordingly, advertisement were published in the leading newspaper on 04.12.2021 as well as uploaded on the website of Ministry of Health & Family Welfare and AIIMS, New Delhi. A copy of the advertisement is enclosed at Annexure-I.

The following in the criteria/adequate for the post of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi:-

- (i) The application were from individuals as well as a nominations from National and International Medical, Education and Research Institutions.
- (ii) The upper age limit was 62 years on the last date of receipt of application/nomination i.e. 30 days from the date of publication of advertisement in Print media i.e. as on 03.01.2022 (02.01.2022 being Sunday).

The south body plans to add eight more mechanised road sweepers to its fleet. "The purchase of eight additional sweepers are in the pipeline," said a civic official. "They will be added soon to the corporation's existing fleet. Four of them are going to be vehicles in the east of the capital.

DMCO uses machines to sweep approximately 30km of roads every day collecting 20 metric tonnes of dust and dirt in eight-hour shifts. The civic body disposes of the dust at the Shaheed Park construction and demolition waste dump. All the road sweepers are fitted with water tanks that spray water on the roads as it moves along. This involves the use of 16,000 to 20,000 litres of recycled water that the corporation sources from the Delhi Jal Board.

Currently we have deployed an adequate number of mechanised sweepers that we require.

DMCO has deployed 1,000 mechanised sweepers that we require. We have asked Delhi government for funding under the National Clean Air Programme for six road sweepers that we require.

N-CORPN SAYS
We have asked Delhi government for funding under the National Clean Air Programme for six more mechanised road sweepers.

According to the Department of Environment Management Services (DEMS), the cash

New Delhi: To prevent road dust adding to the air pollution, all the three municipal corporations have deployed mechanised road sweepers. These machines cover over 2,000 kilometres of road length. The north, south and east civic bodies are not only relying on the road sweepers to pick up the blowing dust along 2,600km of city roads every day, but they also plan to increase the fleet strength from the current 52.

At present, the machine-aided trucks are being used in single shifts by the north and east corporations, while the south corporation is governing areas under its jurisdiction in two shifts.

North Delhi Municipal Corporation has 18 mechanical sweepers which cover 85km of road length in a 12-hour shift every day. They collect 50 metric tonnes of dust and dirt every 11 hours. Sites designated for construction and demolition work during the process. The civic body uses 18,000 to 20,000 litres of water during the process.

1. INTRODUCTION:-

Dr. Randeep Guleria, Professor & Head, Department of Pulmonary Medicine & Sleep was appointed to the post of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi for a period of five years from the date of assumption of charge of post or till attaining the age of 65 years or until further orders, whichever is earlier. Dr. Randeep Guleria assumed the charge of the post of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi on 24.03.2017 (AN) and his tenure as Director, AIIMS, New Delhi was completed on 24.03.2022 (AN).

2. JUSTIFICATION:-

As the process of selection of new Director was underway and it was expected that it will take time to complete the selection process, therefore, there was need to make alternative arrangements till such time, new Director is appointed.

Provision of AIIMS, New Delhi Rules-2019 Clause No. 9 (4) applicable in this regard are under:-

“In the event of the Director proceeding on leave, resigning or retiring, or the post falling vacant in any other eventuality, till such time a new Director is appointed, the President may appoint the senior-most Professor to look after the functions of the Director for a period of not exceeding six months.

Provided that the Institute may appoint, for reasons to be recorded in writing, any other person for a period of not exceeding six months.

Provided further that if the period of such appointment exceed six months prior approval of the Government shall be taken for such appointment”.

The Hon'ble President, AIIMS, New Delhi (being Chairman, Institute Body) had considered the matter and accorded approval for extension of tenure of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi in respect of Dr. Randeep Guleria for three months w.e.f. 25.03.2022 or by the time new Director is appointed, whichever is earlier for ensuring smooth administration of work & continuity of patient care of AIIMS, New Delhi, subject to post-facto approval of the Institute Body.

Accordingly, the tenure of Director, AIIMS, New Delhi in respect of Dr. Randeep Guleria has been extended for a period of three months or by the time new Director is appointed, whichever is earlier for ensuring smooth administration of work & continuity of patient care of AIIMS, New Delhi vide O.M.No.F.1-39/2021-Estt. The Central Government, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 4 of the AIIMS Act, 1956, (25 of 1956) has re-constituted the Institute Body of AIIMS vide Notification No.4754, 1090 & 1090 dated 06.12.2021 & 09.03.2022 in the Gazette of India (Reference Ministry of Health & Family Welfare's File No.V.16011/01/2020-INI-I. The list of Members so nominated on the Institute Body is placed at Annexure-I, II & III.

I. Constitution of Governing Body

Section 10 (1) of the AIIMS Act, 1956 states that there shall be a Governing Body of the Institute which shall be constituted by the Institute from among its members in such manner as may be prescribed by the regulation.

Regulation 5 of the AIIMS Regulations, 2019 (as amended) provides that the Governing Body shall consist of the following eleven members, namely :-

(a)	President of the Institute	Chairman
(b)	Director, General of Health Services	Ex-Officio Member
(c)	Representative of the Ministry of Finance	Member
(d)	Director, All India Institute of Medical Sciences	Member
(e)	One member elected by the members of the Institute form amongst the three members of the Parliament elected to the Institute	Member
(f)	Six Members to be elected by te members of the Institute from amongst themselves.	Member
(g)	Following permanent Special Invitees:-	
	(i) Additional Secretary (in the Ministry of Health and	

	Family Welfare in charge of the Institute), (ii) Joint Secretary (in the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in charge of the Institute), (iii) Dean (Academics), (iv) Deputy Director (Administration), (v) Senior Financial Advisor.	
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The Director shall act as the Secretary to the Institute Body as well as the Governing Body as per Section 11 (2) of the AIIMS Act, 1956.

II. Constitution of Standing Committee.

Section 10 (5) of the AIIMS, Act, 1956 states that subject to such control and restrictions as may be prescribed by rules, the Institute may constitute as many Standing Committee and as many ad-hoc committees as it thinks fit for exercising any power or discharging any function of the Institute or for inquiring into, or reporting or advising upon, any matter which the Institute may refer to them.

According to Section 10 (6) of the AIIMS Act, 1956, a Standing Committee shall consist exclusively of members of the Institute. But an ad-hoc committee may include persons who are not members of the Institute. However, the number of such persons shall not exceed one-half of its total membership.

The following Standing Committees had been established in the past :-

1. Standing Finance Committee
2. Academic Committee
3. Standing Selection Committee
4. Estate Committee
5. Hospital Affairs Committee

1. Standing Finance Committee :

There shall be a Standing Finance Committee which shall include member representing the Ministry of Finance as provided in Rule 6(1) of the AIIMS Rules 1958 which is also nominated by the President, AIIMS (Annexure-IV).

The Institute may also constitute any other standing or ad-hoc committees in accordance with sub-sections (5) & (6) of Section 10 of the AIIMS Act, 1956.

2. Standing Selection Committee :

The Director General of Health Services shall be a member of all Selection Committees constituted by the Institute for recruitment tot faculty posts as per Rule 7 (2) of the AIIMs Rules, 1958.

3 & 4 Standing Academic Committee and Estate Committee:

Regulation 12 of the AIIMS Regulations, 1999 states the following: -

- (1) In addition to the Standing Finance Committee, the Institute may constitute other Standing Committees in accordance with sub-section (5) of Section 10 of the Act, Consisting of a Chairman, a Vice-Chairman and not more than seven other members. The Director shall be a member and Ex-Officio Secretary of each committee. The Chairman, the Vice-Chairman and other members of each committee shall be nominated by the Institute.
- (2) In particular a Standing Committee to be called the Academic Committee for the purpose of considering the matters specified in clause (a) to (o) of Section 14 of the Act and another Standing Committee to be called the Estate Committee for the purpose of considering additions and alterations to buildings belonging to the Institute and other questions relating to their maintenance and use, may be constituted.
- (3) The term of office of members of a Standing Committee shall be five years. An out-going member shall be eligible for re-nomination.
- (4) A casual vacancy in a Standing Committee may be filled by the President by nomination.
- (5) All Standing Committees shall be advisory Committees.

As per Regulation 12 of the AIIMS Regulations, 2019 states the following: -

- (1) All the standing Committees shall be advisor Committee.
- (2) Fifty per cent of the members shall form the quorum for all standing Committee Members can also participate in the meeting through video conference, after obtaining the prior approval of the Chairman and such participation through video conference will be counted for the purpose of the quorum. In the case of Standing Selection Committee or combined Selection Committee or regional selection Committee, the two experts shall also be counted for purpose of determining the quorum.

5. Hospital Affairs Committee:

Though such a committee is not mentioned in the Regulations, it has traditionally been constituted to look after the activities of the AIIMS Hospital under the provisions of Section 10 (5) of the AIIMS Act, 1956.

The term of office of all the aforementioned five committees are governed by the provisions of Regulation 12 of the AIIMS Regulations, 1999 as reproduced above.

Since the term of the last Institute Body came to an end in July 2021, the aforesaid five committees stood dissolved with effect from the end of the term of the previous Institute Body and are required to be constituted afresh, in accordance with the provisions as stated above.

The matter is placed before the Institute Body for constitution of the Governing Body & the four (4) Standing Committees from among its members **and also for ratification of the Standing Finance Committee which is constituted as per the notification file No.17-1/2020-Genl. dated 25.02.2022 (Annexure – V).**

THE ALL-INDIA INSTITUTE OF MEDICAL SCIENCES ACT, 1956

NO. 25 OF 1956

2nd June, 1956

An Act to provide for the establishment of an All-India Institute of Medical Sciences.

Be it enacted by Parliament in the Seventh Year of the Republic of India, as follows :

1. Short title & commencement

- (1) This Act may be called the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences Act, 1956
- (2) It shall come into force on such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.

2. Definitions

In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires—

- (a) 'Funds' means the fund of the Institute referred to in section 16;
- (b) 'Governing Body' means the Governing Body of the Institute;
- (c) 'Institute' means the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences establishment under Section 3;
- (d) 'Member' means a member of the Institute;
- (e) 'Regulation' means a regulation made by the Institute;
- (f) 'Rule' means a rule made by the Central Government.

3. Establishment and incorporation of the Institute.

- (1) With effect from such date as the Central Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette,

appoint in this behalf, there shall be established for the purposes of this Act an institution to be called the All-India Institute of Medical Sciences.

- (2) The Institute shall be a body corporate by the name aforesaid having perpetual succession and a common seal, with power to acquire, hold and dispose of property, both movable and immovable, and to contract, and shall by the said name sue and be sued.

4. Composition of the Institute

The Institute shall consist of the following members, namely:—

- (a) The Vice-Chancellor of the Delhi University, ex-officio;
- (b) The Director-General of Health Services, Government of India, ex-officio;
- (c) The Director of the Institute, ex officio;
- (d) Two representatives of the Central Government, to be nominated by the Government, one from the Ministry of Finance and one from the Ministry of Education;
- (e) Five persons of whom one shall be a non-medical scientist, representing the Indian Science Congress Association, to be nominated by the Central Government;
- (f) Four representatives of the medical faculties of Indian Universities to be nominated by the Central Government in the manner prescribed by rules; and
- (g) Three members of Parliament of whom two shall be elected from among themselves by the members of the House of the People and one from among themselves by the members of the Council of States.

5. Declaration of the Institute as an institution of national importance

It is hereby declared that the Institute shall be an institution of national importance.

6. Term of office of, and vacancies among, members

- (1) Save as otherwise provided in this section, the term of

office of a member shall be five years from the date of his nomination or election:

Provided that the term of office of a member elected under clause (g) of Section 4 shall come to an end as soon as he ceases to be a member of the House from which he was elected.

- (2) The term of office of an ex-officio member shall continue so long as he holds the office by virtue of which he is such a member.
- (3) The term of office of a member nominated or elected to fill a casual vacancy shall continue for the remainder of the term of the member in whose place he is nominated or elected.
- (4) An out-going member shall, unless the Central Government otherwise directs, continue in office until another person is nominated or elected as a member in his place.
- (5) An out-going member shall be eligible for re-nomination or re-election.
- (6) A member may resign his office by writing under his hand addressed to the Central Government but he shall continue in office until his resignation is accepted by that Government.
- (7) The manner of filling vacancies among members shall be such as may be prescribed by rules.

7. President of the Institute

- (1) There shall be a President of the Institute who shall be nominated by the Central Government from among the members other than the Director of the Institute.
- (2) The President shall exercise such powers and discharge such functions as are laid down in this Act or as may be prescribed by rules or regulations.

8. Allowances of President and Members

The President and members shall receive such allowances, if any, from the Institute as may be prescribed by rules.

9. Meeting of the Institute

The Institute shall hold its first meeting at such time and

place as may be appointed by the Central Government and shall observe such rules of procedure in regard to the transaction of business at the first meeting as may be laid down by that Government, and thereafter the Institute shall meet at such times and places and observe such rules of procedure in regard to the transaction of business at its meetings as may be prescribed by regulations.

10. Governing Body and other Committees of the Institute

- (1). There shall be a Governing Body of the Institute which shall be constituted by the Institute from among its members in such manner as may be prescribed by regulations.
- (2) The Governing Body shall be the executive committee of the Institute and shall exercise such powers and discharge such functions as the Institute may, by regulations made in this behalf, confer or impose upon it
- (3) The President of the Institute shall be the Chairman of the Governing Body and as Chairman thereof shall exercise such powers and discharge such functions as may be prescribed by regulations.
- (4) The procedure to be followed in the exercise of its powers and discharge of its functions by the Governing Body, and the term of office of, and the manner of filling vacancies among the members of the Governing Body shall be such as may be prescribed by regulations.
- (5) Subject to such control and restrictions as may be prescribed by rules, the Institute may constitute as many Standing Committees and as many ad hoc committees as it thinks fit for exercising any power or discharging any function of the Institute or for inquiring into, or reporting or advising upon, any matter which the Institute may refer to them.
- (6) A Standing Committee shall consist exclusively of members of the Institute; but an ad hoc committee may include persons who are not members of the Institute but the number of such persons shall not exceed one-half of its total membership.
- (7) The Chairman and members of the Governing Body and the Chairman and members of a standing com-

mittee or an ad hoc committee shall receive such allowances, if any, as may be prescribed by regulations.

11. Staff of the Institute

- (1) There shall be a chief executive officer of the Institute who shall be designated as the Director of the Institute and shall, subject to such rules as may be made by the Central Government in this behalf, be appointed by the Institute;

Provided that the first Director of the Institute shall be appointed by the Central Government

- (2) The Director shall act as the Secretary to the Institute as well as the Governing Body.

- (3) The Director shall exercise such powers and discharge such functions as may be prescribed by regulations or as may be delegated to him by the Institute or the President of the Institute or by the Governing Body or the Chairman of the Governing Body.

- (4) Subject to such rules as may be made by the Central Government in this behalf, the Institute may appoint such number of other officers and employees as may be necessary for the exercise of its powers and discharge of its functions and may determine the designations and grades of such other officers and employees.

- (5) The Director and other officers and employees of the Institute shall be entitled to such salary and allowances and shall be governed by such conditions of service in respect of leave, pension, provident fund and other matters as may be prescribed by regulations made in this behalf.

12. Location of the Institute

The Institute shall be located in New Delhi.

13. Objects of the Institute

The Objects of the Institute shall be:

- (a) To develop patterns of teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate medical education in all its

20 branches so as to demonstrate a high standard of medical education to all medical colleges and other allied institutions in India;

- (b) To bring together in one place educational facilities of the highest order for the training of personnel in all important branches of health activity; and
- (c) To attain self-sufficiency in postgraduate medical education.

14. Functions of the Institute

With a view to the promotion of the objects specified under Section 13, the Institute may —

- (a) Provide for undergraduate and postgraduate teaching in the science of modern medicine and other allied sciences, including physical and biological sciences;
- (b) Provide facilities for research in the various branches of such sciences;
- (c) Provide for the teaching of humanities in the undergraduate courses;
- (d) Conduct experiments in new methods of medical education, both undergraduate and postgraduate, in order to arrive at satisfactory standards of such education;
- (e) Prescribe courses and curricula for both undergraduate and postgraduate studies;
- (f) Notwithstanding anything contained in any other law for the time being in force, establish and maintain—
 - (i) One or more medical colleges with different departments including a department of preventive and social medicine sufficiently staffed and equipped to undertake not only undergraduate medical education but also postgraduate medical education in different subjects;
 - (ii) One or more well-equipped hospitals;
 - (iii) A dental college with such institutional facilities for the practice of dentistry and for the practical training of students as may be necessary;
 - (iv) A nursing college sufficiently staffed and equipped for the training of nurses;
 - (v) Rural and urban health organisations which will form centres for the field training of the

Definitions. — (1) In the regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, — (a) "Act" means the All India Institute of Medical Sciences Act, 1956 (25 of 1956); (b) "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Governing Body under sub-section (3) of section 10 of the Act; (c) "Deputy Director" means the Deputy Director (Administration) of the Institute; (d) "Director" means the Director of the Institute appointed under sub-section (1) of section 11 of the Act; (e) "Fundamental Rules" means the fundamental rules as applicable to Central Government Servants; (f) "General Financial Rules" means the General Financial Rules, 2017 framed and as amended from time to time by the Central Government for financial management and control; (g) "President" means the President of the Institute nominated by the Central Government under sub-section (1) of section 7 of the Act; (h) "Rules" means the rules framed by the Central Government under sub-section (1) of the section 28 of the Act; (i) "Schedule" means a Schedule annexed to these regulations; (j) "Secretary" means a Secretary of the Institute and the Governing Body; (k) "Supplementary Rules" means the Supplementary Rules as applicable to Government servants who are subject to the Fundamental Rules; (l) "Treasury Rules" means the Treasury Rules of the Central Government.

	(2) Words and phrases used in these regulations and not defined but defined in the Act shall have the meanings respectively assigned to them.						
3.	Powers and Functions of the President. —The President shall exercise such powers and discharge such functions as are laid down in the Act, the rules and these regulations including Schedule I.

The agenda shall also be sent alongwith the notice of the meeting and where it is not possible, the agenda shall be sent at least ten days before the meeting either electronically or by speed post.</p> <p>(4) An extraordinary meeting of the Institute may be called by the President at any time for the transaction of urgent business of the Institute.</p> <p>(5) For extraordinary meetings, notices specifying the place, date and time of the meeting shall be sent by the Secretary to the President and the members at least five days before the date of the meeting, under a certificate of posting, if sent by post, or by electronically or by speed post. 18.	Fee and other charges.—All fee and other charges payable by the candidates selected for admission to various courses of Institute shall be as recommended by Academic Committee and approved by the Standing Finance Committee, Governing Body and Institute from time to time.
19.	Admission to courses of studies.—The reservation for the Scheduled Castes (SC), Scheduled Tribes (ST), Other Backward Classes (OBC), Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) and other categories shall be as per policy laid down by the Government of India from time to time.
20.	Award of degrees.—The Institute may grant MBBS, MD, MS, Ph.D, DM, M.Ch, MHA, MDS, Fellowship, M.Sc, M. Biotech, B.Sc. (Honours) Human Biology, B.Sc. (Honours) Nursing, B.Sc. Nursing (Post-certificate), B.Sc. (Honours) in paramedical subjects and any other degrees as the Institute may consider desirable with the approval of Standing Academic Committee of the Institute and ratification by the Governing Body.
21.	Conduct of examination (academic as well as recruitment).—Such number of supervisors, invigilators, examiners (internal or external) and other staff as may be necessary for conducting the examination, paper setting, examination of answer books or thesis, oral and practical of the Institute, may be appointed by the Director and paid remuneration, as recommended by the Academic Committee and approved by the Standing Finance Committee, Governing Body and the Institute from time to time.
22.	Whole time Employees.—Unless, in any case, otherwise it is distinctly provided, the whole time of an employee of the Institute shall be at the disposal of the Institute and he may be employed in any manner as required by the proper authority of the Institute without claim for additional remuneration.
23.	Permanent and Temporary Posts.—(1) The posts in the service of the Institute shall be permanent post that is a post carrying a definite rate of pay sanctioned without any limit of time or a temporary post that is a post carrying a definite rate of pay sanctioned for a limited time. A person occupying a permanent post, on appointment to a higher position for a specified period, shall be allowed to retain his lien in the previous post initially for a maximum of five years, extendable for two years or premature repatriation. (2) Temporary posts of Resident Doctors shall be governed by the Residency Scheme of the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare in the Government of India as modified from time to time.
24.	Qualifications for appointment.—(1) Age, experience and other qualifications for appointment to a post under the Institute shall be prescribed by the appointing authority keeping in view the qualifications and experience prescribed by the Central Government for similar posts before applications of candidates are called for subject to the condition that non-medical personnel shall not be appointed to the post of Director to be notified separately from time to time after approval of the appointing authority. (2) The Director shall, in filling vacancies in posts and services, under the Institute, make such reservations, in favour of the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Classes, Economically Weaker Sections and other categories as may be made by the Central Government from time to time, in filling vacancies in posts and services under the Central Government.
25.	Period of probation.—Unless otherwise decided by the appointing authority in any case, all employees shall be on probation for two years. During the period of probation, the employee shall be required to put in satisfactory service failing which his services shall be liable to termination at any time without any notice or reason being assigned for the same. The appointing authority may, however, extend the period of probation.
26.	Seniority.—The seniority of employees of the Institute in each category shall be determined by the order of merit in which they were selected for appointment to the post in question, those selected on an earlier occasion being ranked senior to those selected later.
27.	Leave.—(1) Temporary and permanent employees of the Institute shall be entitled to such leave and leave salary as are admissible to the corresponding categories of the Central Government servants under the Central Civil Services (Leave) Rules, 1972: Provided that for the purpose of the Central Government Central Civil Services (Leave) Rules, 1972, the following categories of teaching staff in the Institute or any other post declared as academic post by the standing academic committee and ratified by the Governing Body from time to time shall be treated as serving in the vacation Department, namely:- (1) Professor, (2) Additional Professor, (3) Associate Professor, (4) Assistant Professor, (5) Medical Superintendent, (6) Additional Medical Superintendent, (7) Principal, College of Nursing, (8) Lecturers in Nursing, (9) Senior Nursing Tutors, and (10) Tutors in Nursing; (2) The regular vacation for the purpose shall be as may be decided by the Governing Body from time to time:

	Provided that an incumbent on deputation to the Institute as on foreign service shall be governed by the leave rules as may be stipulated in the conditions of their deputation.
28.	<p>Pension and Contributory Provident Fund.—(1) The employees of the Institute, except those on deputation on foreign service to the Institute, appointed on or after 12th September, 1975 and such employees as were appointed prior to this date but have specifically opted for the General Provident Fund and pensionary benefits as applicable to the Central Government employees shall be governed by the provisions of the General Provident Fund (Central Services) Rules, 1960 and the Central Civil Services (Pension) Rules, 1972.</p> <p>(2) With effect from 1st January, 2004, the date on which the New Pension Scheme was introduced, all new entrants who joined the service of the Institute on or after 1st January, 2004, shall be governed by the New Pension Scheme.</p>
29.	Absence from duty. — Unless otherwise decided by the President in exceptional circumstances, no permanent employees of the Institute shall be away from his post, otherwise than on-leave or because of suspension, for periods and purposes stated in the guidelines approved in this regard from time to time by the Governing Body.
30.	<p>Superannuation.—</p> <p>(1) The age of superannuation of an employee of the Institute other than teaching faculty shall be sixty years or as specified by the Government of India from time to time:</p> <p>Provided that the scientific specialists may be granted extension in service, on a case to case basis upto the age of sixty-two years in the case of persons who are exceptionally talented for reasons to be recorded in writing and subject to physical fitness and continued efficiency of the person concerned.</p> <p>(2) The age of superannuation of a member of the teaching faculty of the Institute shall be sixty-five years or as specified by the Government of India from time to time.</p> <p>(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-regulations (1) and (2), the appointing authority shall be of the opinion that it is in the public interest so to do, have the absolute right to retire any employee of the Institute by giving him a notice of not less than three months in writing or three months pay and allowances in lieu of such notice—</p> <p>(i) if he is in Group A or Group B service or post and had entered the service of the Institute before attaining the age of thirty-five years, after he has attained the age fifty years; and</p> <p>(ii) in any other case, after he has attained the age of fifty-five years:</p> <p>Provided that nothing in this sub-regulation shall apply to an employee in Group D service or post who entered the service on or before the 1st December, 1962</p> <p>(4) Any employee of the Institute may, by giving notice of not less than three months in writing to the appointing authority, retire from the service after he has attained the age of fifty years, if he is in Group A or Group B service or post and had entered the service of the Institute before attaining the age of thirty-five years, and in all other cases after he has attained the age of fifty-five years:</p> <p>Provided that,—</p> <p>(a) nothing in this sub-regulation shall apply to an employee in Group D service or post who entered service on or before the 1st December, 1962;</p> <p>(b) it shall be open to the appointing authority to withhold permission to an employee under suspension who seeks to retire under this sub-regulation.</p> <p><i>Explanation.</i>—In this regulation the expression "member of the teaching faculty" means the Professor, Additional Professor, Associate Professor, Assistant Professor, Medical Superintendent, Additional Medical Superintendent, Principal of College of Nursing, Lecturer in Nursing, Senior Nursing Tutor and Tutor in Nursing and other employees of the Institute as may be declared to be members of the teaching faculty by the Central Government from time to time.</p>
31.	<p>Term of office of Director.—(1) The Director shall have a term of five years from the date of assumption of charge of the post or till he attains the age of sixty-five years, whichever is earlier.</p> <p>(2) Notwithstanding anything contained in these regulations, the Institute shall, if it is of the opinion that it is in the public interest to do so, have the right to terminate the term of office of Director at any time before the expiry of his term by giving him a notice of not less than three months in writing or three months salary and allowances in lieu thereof. The Director shall also have the right to relinquish his office at any time before the expiry of the fixed term by giving to the Institute a notice of not less than three months in writing.</p>
32.	Age at recruitment. —The maximum age of a candidate at the time of recruitment to the service of the Institute shall normally be fifty years for teaching posts and thirty years for non teaching posts or as indicated in the recruitment rules for each post (except for Senior Demonstrators or Senior Residents in all Departments of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences where it shall be thirty-three years or as recommended by the Standing Academic Committee from time to time). This limit is relaxable by the Governing Body.
33.	Conduct, discipline and penalties. —(1) The Central Civil Services (Conduct) Rules, 1964 as modified from time to time, shall apply to the employees of the Institute.

(2) Part IV (Suspension), Part V (Penalties and Disciplinary Authorities), Part VI (Procedure for imposing penalties), Part VII (Appeals) and Part VIII (Review) of the Central Civil Service (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, 1965 as modified from time to time, shall apply to the employees of the Institute:

Provided that for the purpose of this regulation,—

(a) Group A, Group B, Group C and D post in the Institute shall correspond to the Central Civil Services Group A, Group B, Group C and Group D post respectively;

(b) the Appointing Authority, the disciplinary Authority for the penalties that may be imposed and the Appellate Authority for the various posts in the Institute shall be as prescribed in Schedule II;

(c) in respect of Central or State Government servants borrowed by the Institute, the provision respectively of rules 20 and 21 of the Central Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, 1965 shall apply and the Institute shall exercise the functions of the Central or State Government, as the case may be, for the purpose of these rules;

(d) no consultation with the Union Public Service Commission shall be necessary in any case.

34. Medical facilities for employees.—(1) The employees of the Institute including deputationists and members of their families shall be entitled to medical aid as admissible under the All India Institute of Medical Sciences Staff Health Scheme. They shall also pay such contribution as are required under that Scheme.

(2) In the case of retired employees of the Institute and members of their families as well as those employees and their family members who avail medical facilities in places other than the place of the Institute, the Central Services Medical Attendants Rules, 1944 as amended from time to time, shall apply. In case of any difficulty, the re-imbursment of medical expenses incurred in such cases be done as per applicable rates of Central Government Health Scheme.

35. Other conditions of service.—In respect of matters not provided for in these regulations, the rules as applicable to the Central Government servants regarding the general conditions of service, pay, allowances including travelling and daily allowances, leave salary, joining time, foreign service terms and orders and decisions issued in this regard by the Central Government from time to time shall apply to the employees of the Institute.

36. Allotment of Institute residence to employees.—The employees of the Institute shall be entitled to the allotment of residences at the All India Institute of Medical Sciences in accordance with the provisions laid down by the Institute from time to time.
